IEDC Awards \$30 Million in READI 2.0 Funding for Accelerate Rural Indiana Region

IEDC Presents \$30 Million Indiana READI 2.0 Award to Accelerate Rural Indiana Region



The Accelerate Rural Indiana (ARI) Region, which includes Batesville, Greensburg, Rushville, and Shelbyville along with Decatur, Rush, and Shelby counties, will receive \$30 million from Indiana's Regional Economic Acceleration and Development Initiative (READI 2.0) funding. The award represents over \$300 per capita of READI 2.0 investment in the ARI Region, which is the largest per capita READI investment in the state. This historic investment in one of only two exclusively rural/rural-mixed regions in Indiana will accelerate growth along the I-74 corridor and reimagine one of Indiana's greatest assets – its rural frontier.

In 2021, the ARI Region was awarded \$20 million in READI 1.0 funding, also the highest per-capita READI award in the state. In total, the ARI Region's READI 1.0 project portfolio is expected to attract nearly \$500 million of public and private investment to the region by 2026. Nearly \$10 million in funding has been dispersed for seven projects across the ARI region. ARI is one of only four regions to receive an increased award amount from READI 1.0 to READI 2.0. ARI's READI 2.0 award will build upon the region's READI 1.0 success.

Having previously blazed a path of rural excellence in Southeastern Indiana through READI 1.0, Accelerate Rural Indiana communities will capitalize on the \$30 million READI 2.0 investment to prove that housing growth, job creation, entertainment attraction, and – most importantly – population growth in rural regions is possible.

New Company Coming Soon... RISU Plastics to become the 14th Japanese Company in Shelbyville



RISU America, Inc., a Japanese manufacturer of plastic pallets and containers, recently finalized the lengthy process of evaluating sites for a new manufacturing facility in the United States. Shelby County Development Corporation has been actively working on the project since 2022 and we are pleased to report that the company selected a 29-acre site on West Boomer Way, near Shelbyville's Northridge Industrial Park, to establish their new U.S. manufacturing facility.

RISU America, Inc. will invest \$44 million for construction of their new manufacturing facility, and installation of production machinery and equipment. The company will generate 28 new jobs by 2028. RISU America, Inc. will be the 14th Japanese industry with a presence in Shelby County.

State Employment and Unemployment

STATE EMPLOYMENT AND UNEMPLOYMENT -- March 2024 Unemployment rates were lower in March in 6 states, higher in 1 state, and stable in 43 states and the District of Columbia, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported. Twenty-nine states had jobless rate increases from a year earlier, 1 state had a decrease, and 20 states and the District had little change. The national unemployment rate changed little at 3.8 percent but was 0.3 percentage point higher than in March 2023. Nonfarm payroll employment increased in 5 states and was essentially unchanged in 45 states and the District of Columbia in March 2024. Over the year, nonfarm payroll employment increased in 31 states and was essentially unchanged in 19 states and the District.
